## *Clinical Diabetes* Special Issue on Diabetes Technology

The editors of *Clinical Diabetes* seek manuscript submissions for a special-topic issue on Diabetes Technology scheduled for publication in mid-December 2018. Numerous new technologies have emerged or are in development to improve diabetes management and ease the burden of living with the disease. However, issues of access, cost, insurance coverage, and accuracy remain challenges, as does the key question of how best to use the plethora of data these technologies provide.

**ARTICLE FOCUS:** The editors seek articles on a wide range of topics under the broad general umbrella of “diabetes technology.” These could include research reports, descriptions of innovative programs or initiatives, review articles, or commentaries on any diabetes-related technology, from smartphone apps and electronic medical records to the latest glucose monitoring devices and novel wearable or implantable technologies. Articles that focus on the incorporation of new technologies in the primary care setting are of particular interest.

**SUBMISSION CRITERIA:** When submitting a manuscript through the submission site, please mention “Special-Topic Issue: Diabetes Technology” in the online cover letter and select “Special Issue 2018” as the manuscript category. Submissions may include stand-alone papers (“Feature Articles”) or papers tailored for any of the following journal departments: Commentary, Practical Pointers, Translating Research to Practice, Quality Improvement Success Story, or Case Study. Please mention in your cover letter which type of article you are submitting and follow the format and submission guidelines available in the Information for Authors at [clinical.diabetesjournals.org](http://clinical.diabetesjournals.org).

All submissions will be considered for publication in *Clinical Diabetes* even if they are not selected for inclusion in the special-topic issue and will be subject to the journal’s standard peer-review and publication policies.
